



All India Impact Based Weather Warning Bulletin

Friday 03 December 2021
Time of Issue: 2050 hours IST

(NIGHT)

03 December (Day 1): ♦ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** very likely at isolated places over north Coastal Andhra Pradesh and south Odisha.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamilnadu, South Interior Karnataka, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe.

♦ **Gale wind** speed reaching 70-80 kmph gusting to 90 kmph prevails over Westcentral Bay of Bengal. **Squally wind** speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph likely to commence along & off North Andhra Pradesh–Odisha coasts from the mid-night of today. **Sea condition** would be high over Westcentral Bay of Bengal during next 12 hours and high to very high over Westcentral and northwest Bay of Bengal from the early morning of 4th Dec; rough to very rough over along & off North Andhra Pradesh–Odisha coasts from the mid-night of 3rd December. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

04 December (Day 2): ♦ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **extremely heavy falls** very likely at isolated places over north Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Odisha; **heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal and **heavy rainfall** at isolated places over Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal and **with lightning** at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe.

♦ **Gale winds** speed reaching 90-100 kmph gusting to 110 kmph over west-central & adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal from 4th evening for the subsequent 12 hours and speed reaching 80-90 kmph gusting to 100 kmph along & off North Andhra Pradesh–Odisha coasts from 4th evening til 5th morning. **Squally wind** speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph likely to commence along & off West Bengal coast from 4th December evening. **Sea condition** will be High to very High over west-central & northwest Bay of Bengal from the early morning of 4th December and along & off North Andhra Pradesh–Odisha coasts from 4th Afternoon. It will be rough to very rough along & off West Bengal coast from 4th morning and very rough to High from the same evening for the subsequent 12 hours. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

05 December (Day 3): ♦ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** very likely at isolated places over north Odisha and Gangetic West Bengal and **heavy rainfall** likely at isolated places over Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty wind (speed reaching 40-50 kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal and **with lightning** at isolated places over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, West Uttar Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe, Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura.

♦ **Gale wind** speed reaching 60-70 kmph gusting to 80 kmph likely to commence along & off West Bengal coast from the morning of 5th December for the subsequent 12 hours and gradually decrease thereafter. **Squally winds** speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph over northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off Odisha coast. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

06 December (Day 4): ♦ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and **heavy rainfall** likely at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal and Kerala & Mahe.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura.

♦ **Dense fog** likely in isolated pockets over Punjab and Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi.

* Red color warning does not mean "Red Alert" Red color warning means "Take Action".

Forecast and Warning for any day is valid from 0830 hours IST of day till 0830 hours IST of next day

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07 December (Day 5): ♦ Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe.

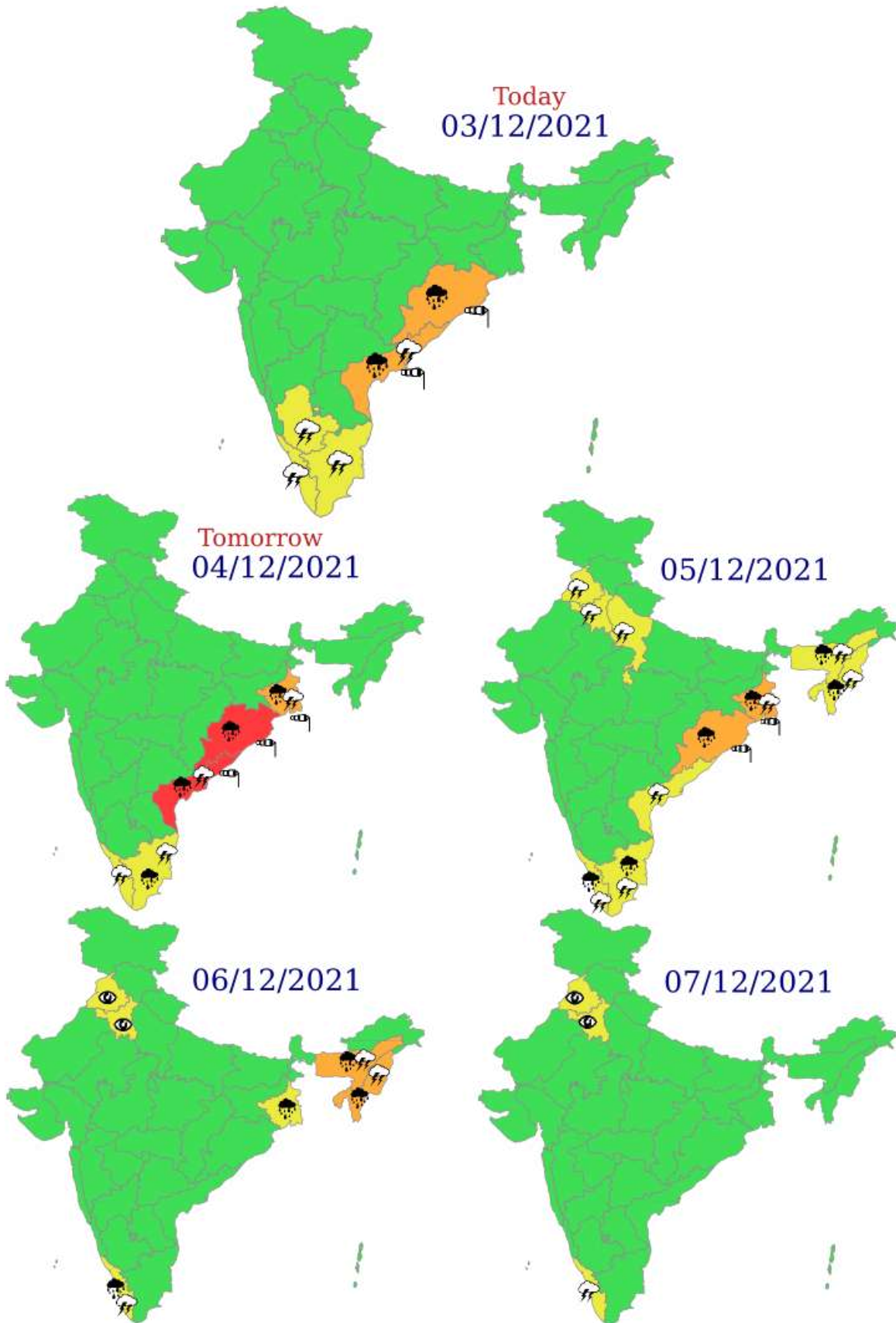
♦ Dense fog likely in isolated pockets over Punjab and Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi.

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EXPECTED IMPACT & ACTION SUGGESTED due to;

- I. Isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall** over Odisha and north Coastal Andhra Pradesh on 04th December;
- II. Very Heavy Rainfall** over north Coastal Andhra Pradesh on 03rd December; over Gangetic West Bengal 04th & 05th ; over Odisha on 03rd & 05th ; over Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 06th December, 2021.

A. Impact Expected

- **Localized Flooding of roads, inundation and water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the affected region.**
- **Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.**
- **Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.**
- **Minor damage to kutcha roads.**
- **Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.**
- **Localized Landslides/Mudslides**
- **Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.**
- **It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)**

B. Action Suggested

- **Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.**
- **Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.**
- **Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.**
- **Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.**
- **Harvest the ripen crops like Paddy & Horticultural crops and also secure the harvested crops securely from the damage due to rain and strong winds.**
