All India Impact Based Weather Warning Bulletin

Weather Warnings for next 7 days is given below:

(Graphics for warnings & rainfall distribution (Table 1) are given below the text:

**20<sup>th</sup> January (Day 1):**

- ❖ **Dense fog conditions** very likely in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand, West Rajasthan, north Madhya Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during night/morning hours.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 35 kmph to 45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph** likely to prevail over gulf of Mannar and adjoining Comorin area, adjoining south Sri Lanka coast. Fishermen are advised not to venture in to these areas.

**21<sup>st</sup> January (Day 2):**

- ❖ **Dense fog conditions** very likely in isolated pockets of Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during night/morning hours.

**22<sup>nd</sup> January (Day 3):**

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh, Haryana and Rajasthan.

**23<sup>rd</sup> January (Day 4):**

**Cold day conditions** likely in isolated pockets of Himachal Pradesh.

**24<sup>th</sup> January (Day 5):**

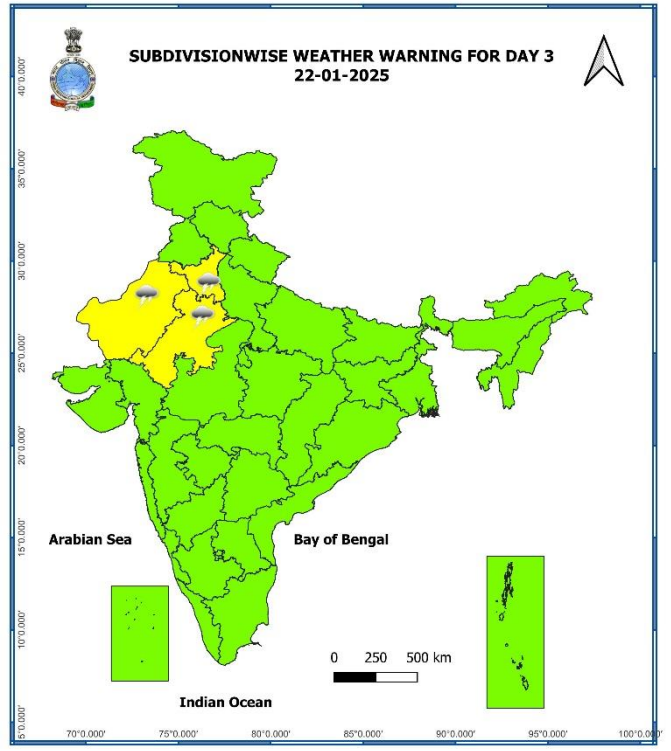
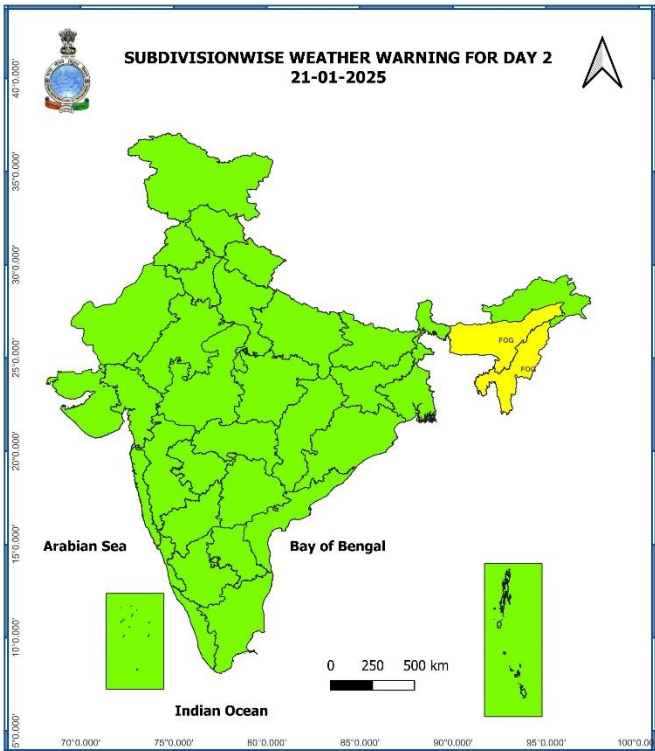
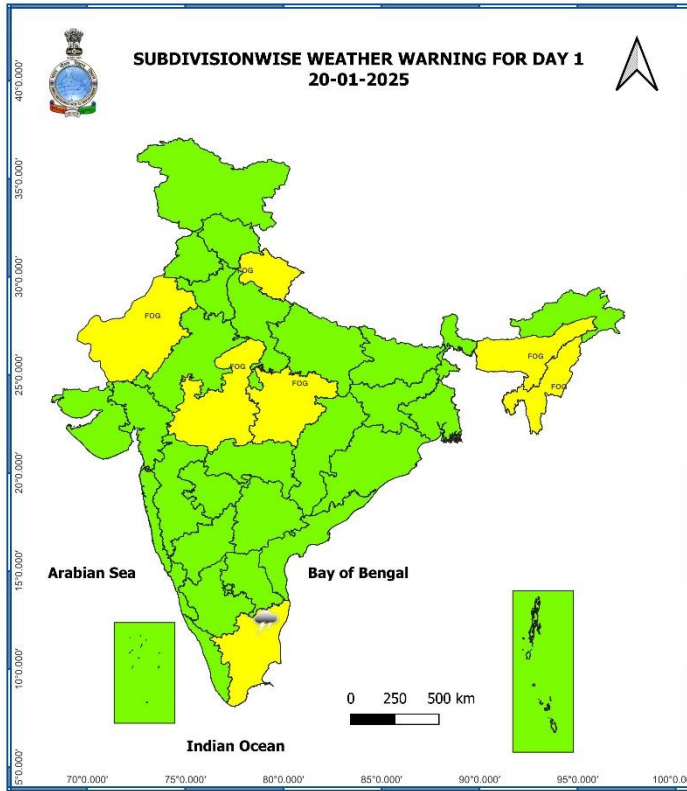

### Impact expected due to dense/very dense fog in the night /morning hour:

#### ❖ Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

#### ❖ Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

#### ❖ Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

### Action suggested:

#### ❖ Transport and Aviation:

- Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.
- Use fog lights during driving.
- Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.

#### ❖ Power Sector:

- To keep ready Maintenance Team.
- Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.

### Impact expected due to Cold Day/Severe Cold day conditions

- An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.
- Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

### Action suggested:

- Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing.
- Cover your head, neck, hands and toes adequately as majority of heat loss occurs through these body parts. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm Woolen clothing rather than one layer of heavy cloth.
- Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- Protect livestock from cold weather.



### Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall over Tamil Nadu and Kerala

- Drain out excess water from rice, sugarcane, cotton, turmeric, vegetables, and other standing crop fields, as well as coconut and banana orchards in **Tamil Nadu** and from rice, coffee, banana, coconut, areca nut, ginger, pepper, cardamom and other standing crops in **Kerala**.
- Keep the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking to vegetables.

### Livestock

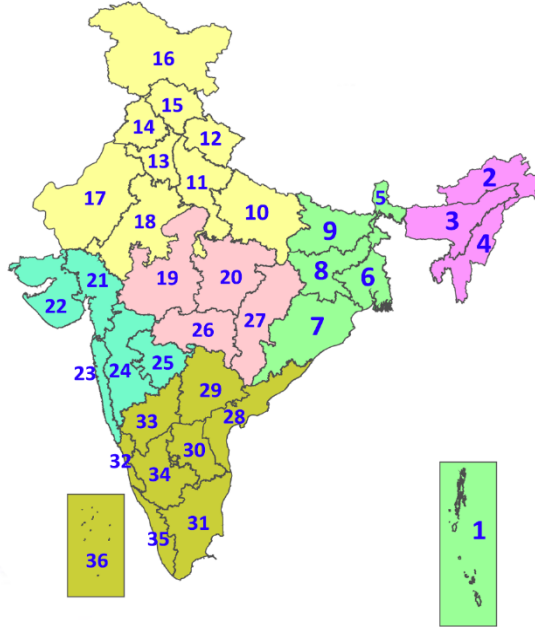
- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall period and provide them balanced feed.
- Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Check and disinfect poultry houses to prevent disease outbreaks due to dampness.

#### Rain/ Snow \*

**Heavy:** 64.5 to 115.5 mm/cm \*  
**Very Heavy:** 115.6 to 204.4 mm/cm\*  
**Extremely Heavy:** > 204.4 mm/cm \*

#### Heat Wave

When maximum temperature of a station reaches  $\geq 40^\circ\text{C}$  for plains and  $\geq 30^\circ\text{C}$  for hilly regions

(a) Based on Departure from normal

**Heat Wave:** Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .

**Severe Heat Wave:** Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $\geq 6.5^\circ\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

**Heat Wave:** When actual maximum temperature  $\geq 45^\circ\text{C}$ .

**Severe Heat Wave:** When actual maximum temperature  $\geq 47^\circ\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is  $> 4.5^\circ\text{C}$  from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature  $\geq 37^\circ\text{C}$

#### Warm Night

When maximum temperature remains  $40^\circ\text{C}$

**Warm Night:** When minimum temperature departure  $4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .

**Severe Warm Night:** When minimum temperature departure  $> 6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .

#### Cold Wave

When minimum temperature of a station  $\leq 10^\circ\text{C}$  for plains and  $\leq 0^\circ\text{C}$  for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

**Cold Wave:** Minimum Temperature Departure from normal  $-4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $-6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .

**Severe Cold Wave:** Minimum Temperature Departure from normal  $\leq -6.5^\circ\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

**Cold Wave :** When Minimum Temperature is  $\leq 4.0^\circ\text{C}$

**Severe Cold Wave:** When Minimum Temperature is  $\leq 2.0^\circ\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is  $\leq -4.5^\circ\text{C}$  & actual Minimum Temperature is  $\leq 15^\circ\text{C}$

#### Cold Day

When minimum temperature of a station  $\leq 10^\circ\text{C}$  for plains and  $\leq 0^\circ\text{C}$  for hilly regions

Based on departure

**Cold Day:** Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $-4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $-6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .

**Severe Cold Day:** Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $\leq -6.5^\circ\text{C}$

#### Fog

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility  $< 1\text{km}$

**Moderate Fog:** When the visibility between 500-200 metres

**Dense Fog:** when the visibility between 50- 200 metres

**Very Dense Fog:** when the visibility  $< 50$  metres

#### Thunderstorm

Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)

#### Dust/Sand Storm

An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.

#### Frost

Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature  $\leq 4^\circ\text{C}$  ( over Plains)

#### Squall

A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

**Moderate:** Wind speed 52-61 kmph

**Severe:** Wind speed 62-87 kmph

**Very Severe:** Wind speed  $> 87$  kmph

#### Sea State

Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

**Rough to very rough:** Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre

**High to very high:** Wind speed 63-117 kmph ( 34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre

**Phenomenal:** Wind speed  $> 117$  kmph ( $> 63$  knots) & Wave height  $> 14$  metre

#### Cyclone

**Cyclonic Storm:** Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

**Severe Cyclonic Storm:** Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)

**Very Severe Cyclonic Storm:** Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)

**Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm:** Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)

**Super Cyclone Strom:** Wind speed  $> 220$  kmph ( $> 119$  knots)
