All India Weather Warning Bulletin

Weather Warnings for next 7 days is given below: (Graphics for warnings & rainfall distribution (Table 1) are given below the text:

27th March (Day 1):

- ❖ **Heavy rainfall/snowfall** very likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.
- ❖ Thunderstorm accompanied with gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & lightning very likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh; with gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Punjab, South Interior Karnataka; with lightning likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ Dust raising winds (speed reaching 20 30 kmph) very likely at isolated places over West Rajasthan.
- ❖ Hot day conditions very likely at isolated pockets of West Uttar Pradesh.

28th March (Day 2):

- **Heavy rainfall/snowfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh.
- ❖ Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ Hot day conditions very likely at isolated pockets of Gangetic West Bengal.
- **\Delta** Hot and Humid Conditions very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam.

29th March (Day 3):

- **Heavy rainfall/snowfall** likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh.
- ❖ Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- Heat wave conditions likely at isolated places over Interior Odisha.
- ❖ Hot and Humid Conditions likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Gujarat Region.









Region wise classification of meteorological Sub-Divisions:

- Central India: West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Chhattisgarh.
- **East India:** Bihar, Jharkhand, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Northeast India: Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura.
- **West India:** Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada.
- **South India:** Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep.
