National level Workshop Launch-cum-Training of MIS and Mobile App for Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme

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1. Background

The Government of India in 2015 conceptualized a scheme called 'Aapda Mitra', i.e. 'friends during disaster'. The initiative aims to train community volunteers in the skills they would need to response to their community's immediate needs in the aftermath of a disaster. As first responders to any disaster, these skills would enable them to undertake basic relief and rescue tasks during emergency situations.

The Aapda Mitra volunteers are trained in various aspect of response such as first aid, search and rescue, management of community shelters, psycho – social counseling, distribution of relief and accessing support from government and other agencies.

National Disaster Management Authority, Ministry of Home affairs, Government of India, is implementing "Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme" in all the States/UTs which aims to successfully train one hundred thousand (1 Lakh) community volunteers including 30% women's to respond to all local hazards, thereby preparing the communities in India to become more disaster resilient.

For smooth implementation of Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme across the nation which has several stakeholders and various data are required to be collected from the States/UTs, a Management Information System (MIS) is very much required. Information such as details of trained volunteers, their insurance status, identity card, certificates, training details, trainers details, training institutions' profiles, procurement of Emergency Responder Kit (ERK) and its distribution amongst the trained volunteers, procurement of Emergency Essential Resource Reserve (EERR), Financial data, etc. will assist in analyzing the progress of implementation of the scheme at National and States levels. For authenticity and accuracy of data, Analysis of the data from different sources, reports generation and smooth implementation of the Scheme a centralized computer-based Management Information System is required.

Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring Centre (KSNDMC) has developed a software platform, i.e. Management Information System (MIS) with different roles and privileges for various stake holders and Mobile Application for volunteers to stay informed on the training materials, video manuals, dos and don'ts, share location with the state nodal officers etc under the "Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme" in consultation with NDMA. It is a volunteer endeavour of KSNDMC. NDMA highly appreciates the initiatives of KSNDMC.

Salient Features of the MIS and Mobile App:

• One centralized web-based tool for all information gathering and report generation with various levels access from anywhere and any location in India.



- With the Use of Open-source Technology the MIS system is fully customizable and scalable to deal with large amount of data compilation in view of future upscale of the Scheme.
- MIS and Mobile App are on the single platform, which make monitoring and overall system faster, accurate and easier to manage.
- MIS is fully customized to further future addition to new modules for the Scheme as per future requirement, if any.
- MIS fully supports Multi-lingual languages for the contents etc.
- Digital ID card and Certificate generation verifiable through Bar Code Scanning.
- Real time Location tracking of the volunteer though the mobile app and constant interaction with them.
- To create a Community Emergency Stockpile/Reserve at the district/block level containing essential light search and rescue equipment, medical first aid kits, etc;

2. Inaugural Session

A National level launching-cum-training workshop for MIS & Mobile App for Up-scaling of

Aapda Mitra Scheme was organized by National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in collaboration with Karnataka State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) and Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring Centre (KSNDMC) in 22nd July 2022. Bengaluru on was inaugurated by Shri workshop Basavaraj Bommai. Hon'ble Chief Minister, Govt. of Karnataka and attended by Shri R. Ashoka, Hon'ble Revenue



Minister, Govt. of Karnataka, Mrs. Vandita Sharma, Chief Secretary, Govt. of Karnataka, Shri Rajendra Singh, Member, NDMA, Shri SR Umashankar, Principal Secretary, Govt. of Karnataka, Shri Kunal Satyarthi, Joint Secretary, NDMA, Dr Manoj Rajan, Commissioner, KSNDMC and other senior officials from NDMA and Government of Karnataka. Representatives including Nodal Officers from 35 States/UTs participated in the workshop (32 States/UTs were physically present and Andaman & Nicobar Island, Lakshadweep and Manipur were present virtually).



2.1 Dr. Manoj Rajan, Commissioner, KSNDMC began by welcoming the dignitaries and all the participants from across the country for attending this most important Launching Cum Training Workshop on Management Information System (MIS) and Mobile Application under the Up-Scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme and he explained about the objectives of the workshop and how this workshop would be beneficial for all the States and UTs in term of better implementation of the Scheme by using the



MIS Portal and Mobile Application and upload the required information on MIS for handling any disaster in more pragmatic manner. In the up-scaling phase of Aapda Mitra Scheme, an efficient Management Information System (MIS) is very much required for the smooth implementation. Keeping view of customized requirements and database of all allied information Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring Centre (KSNDMC) has prepared that Management Information System (MIS) and Mobile Application for the "Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme" in consultation with NDMA.

2.2 Shri Kunal Satyarthi, Joint Secretary, NDMA congratulated Govt. of Karnataka to



volunteer in the launch of MIS and Mobile App and said, "It is a great initiative by Karnataka Government who is first to take up this kind of initiative." He further deliberated upon the 10 point agenda of Hon'ble Prime Minister by saying "I quote the 10 point Agenda announced by Hon'ble Prime Minster which states that, over the last two decades, most community-based efforts have been confined to disaster preparedness and contingency planning for the short term. It is necessary to

expand the scope of community-based efforts and support communities to identify local risk reduction measures and implement them. Such efforts reduce risk and create opportunities for local development and sustainable livelihoods. Localization of disaster risk reduction will also ensure that good use is made of the traditional best practices and indigenous knowledge.



Response agencies need to interact with their communities and make them familiar with the essential drill of disaster response. With respect to this our today's initiative is a significant step in ensuring a robust tomorrow for the people of India living in disaster prone areas and the country at large." He also emphasized on the importance of the community volunteers and stressed that the community itself is a first victim as well as first responder. So there is a critical need to train such community volunteers in certain basic skills in disaster management so that they are able to respond promptly and also assist the concerned agencies in rescue and relief operations.

2.3 During the inaugural session Shri Rajendra Singh, Member, NDMA delivered special address highlighting importance of volunteerism in disaster management and how volunteers play important role in Disaster Response and Disaster Risk Reduction. He also congratulated Govt. of Karnataka, the Karnataka State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) and the Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring Centre (KSNDMC) for collaborating on this most



important aspect of Volunteer Management i.e. Management Information System (MIS) and Mobile Application which would further assist NDMA and other critical agencies to mobilize trained human resource during disasters or emergencies. Apart from it, he also talked about other initiatives are being taken in many States and UTs, where volunteers have played very significant role in disaster management and overall risk reduction, especially during the recent Covid-19 pandemic (such as sensitization, vaccination, patients management, counseling etc), when the other agencies had limitations/ came to a halt. Now it's the high time to consolidate all these voluntary efforts to connect communities easily on the ground, extend timely help and all the required support in a coordinated manner.



2.4 Launching of MIS portal by Shri Basavaraj Bommai, Hon'ble Chief Minister, GoK

Hon'ble Chief Minister. Government of Karnataka launched the MIS portal for Upscaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme, he addressed that "Our Hon'ble PM is a leader who leads by example and he has once again set a right example in terms of community based disaster management. Launch of MIS and Aapda Mitra training are the examples of how our Hon'ble PM converts his ideas into



actions and takes it to the last mile". He further added that, "Response is one factor that is important of course but taking up responsibility to take up disaster management is most important. Communities have to be well prepared, well trained and well equipped to handle any disaster." He also stressed upon standardization of disaster management system throughout the country to reduce the impact of disasters on human lives and their livelihoods. He also highlighted the importance of efforts of every individual in minimizing the risks of disasters. Shri Bommai expressed his gratitude to Hon'ble Prime Minister for pioneering the concept of volunteerism in disaster management and congratulated NDMA for formulating and implementing the Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme in all the States and Union Territories of the country.

2.5 Release of Aapda Mitra Mobile Application by Shri. R. Ashoka, Hon'ble Revenue Minister, GoK

Shri R. Ashoka, Hon'ble Revenue Minister, Government of Karnataka launched the Aapda Mitra Mobile App, during the Inaugural Session. Handbook on Training of Aapda Mitra in regional language of Karnataka was released by Mrs. Vandita Sharma, Chief Secretary, Government of Karnataka. Shri Rajendra Singh, Member, NDMA released the Aapda Mitra MIS Portal User Manual during the session. Shri S R Umashakar, IAS, Principal Secretary, Revenue Department, Government of Karnataka, released the Insurance Certificate for the Aapda Mitra Volunteers during the programme. Inaugural Session was followed by two technical sessions.

3. Technical Session-I

3.1 Presentation on Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme by Shri Nawal Prakash, Joint Advisor, NDMA

First technical session started with a presentation by Shri Nawal Prakash, Joint Advisor, NDMA highlighting the key components of the Scheme. During his presentation he also appreciated the States/UTs which are implementing the scheme successfully and also urged rest of the States/UTs to expedite the implementation.



3.2 Presentation on Insurance Product by Ms. Anita Sharma, Chief Manager, New India Assurance Co. Ltd

Chief General Manager of New India Assurance Company Ltd., Mrs. Anita Sharma while making her presentation highlighted the key features of the Insurance Product especially designed for the Aapda Mitra Volunteers. She informed that each and every trained volunteer under this scheme would have a life coverage of Rs. 5 lacs and medical coverage of up to Rs. 50,000. Dedicated nodal officer for smooth coordination with States/ UTs have also been identified by the New India Assurance Company Ltd.



3.3 Presentation on Salient Feature of MIS and Mobile Application by Dr. Manoj Rajan, Commissioner, KSNDMC

During this session Dr. Manoj Rajan, Commissioner, KSNDMC highlighted the importance, objective and key features of MIS and Mobile app. He, particularly, emphasized that the MIS Portal will reflect the various stages of progress of implementation of the Scheme and will also give the details of trained volunteers. With the help of this Portal, monitoring of





implementation of the Scheme in any particular State/ UT will be very easy.

3.4 Presentation by States on successful implementation of the Scheme:

During the Session 8 States/UTs, viz., Assam, Bihar, Goa, Karnataka, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Uttar Pradesh and Tripura presented their experiences and best practices under Up-Scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme. (State presentations are attached at Annexure-IV)

Some of the important key learnings and best practices shared by Aapda Mitra Project States

Assam- Assam has shared some best practices of Aapda Mitra Volunteers such as cremation of Covid-19 death, blood donation, snake bite patient brought to the district hospital, helping traffic police to divert the vehicles from flood inundated roads, helping district administration in distribution of GR items, recued passengers after bus accident, visited the victims houses died in Ukraine Russia War, rescued pilgrims in Bhuban Hill, etc.

Bihar- Till June, 2022 Bihar has successfully trained 516 volunteers in 12 batches, these trained Aapda Mitra volunteers are being engaged in lighting awareness generation activities at the ground level.

<u>Goa-</u> Goa has presented its initiatives in IT- related features on the scheme such as Live Calls, Daily Situation Report and geo- referencing the location of the community volunteers across the state of Goa which is available on the department official website portal. During the presentation Goa has also showed a small video on Aapda Mitra volunteers sharing training experiences.

<u>Karnataka</u>- Government of Karnataka has conducted Aapda Mitra Training pogramme of 3400 volunteers in all 11 districts simultaneously. The training programme is being conducted by Karnataka State Fire and Emergency Department.

<u>Meghalaya</u>- Major Focus of the Meghalaya was to train Aapda Mitra volunteers by using of traditional coping mechanism and indigenous skills. They are also providing specialized training by using local recourses and improvised disaster management equipment.

<u>Mizoram-</u> In some of the villages in Mizoram, A Disaster Management Committee has been constituted comprising of trained Aapda Mitra volunteers to spread awareness about construction safety, structural and non-structural mitigation, preparation of Village Disaster Management Plan, Formation of village level Task Force, Family Preparedness Plan, Mountain (Alpine style) search & rescue and traditional method of Search & Rescue for missing person.

<u>Tripura-</u> Tripura has shared that how Aapda Mitra Volunteers are being trained to make customized lightning arresters which are installed at the critical infrastructures and volunteers are also trained in emergency communication i.e. HAM radio handling at the village level.

<u>Uttar Pradesh</u> In Uttar Pradesh Aapda Mitra volunteers were engaged in Crowd Management and other disaster management activities on special occasions such as Karthik Purnima, Durga Puja, Chhath Puja etc. During Ganga Snan, trained Aapda Mitra Volunteers were also engaged in rescue operation. Apart from this, these volunteers were deployed during Covid-19 for sensitization of general public in Gorakhpur district.



4. Technical Session- II

4.1 Presentation of Various module of MIS portal and Mobile Application by Shri Sumeendranath, IT consultant, KSNDMC

During the Workshop-cum-Training a dedicated session was organized for hands on practice for all State participants on MIS and Mobile app. At the beginning of this session, Shri Sumeendranath, IT Consultant, KSNDMC made a detailed presentation (Annexure-III) on the processes of operating the MIS Portal as well as Mobile App.



4.2 Live demo on using the MIS and Mobile Application by Shri Sumeendranath, IT consultant, KSNDMC and Shri Abhinand, SRO, KNSDMC

He also deliberated upon the workflow of the MIS Portal. Key highlights of the Mobile App were also shared during his presentation. It was informed that the Mobile App will be multi-lingual and it will contain all the relevant information related to disaster management e.g., Do's and Don'ts, Handbook and Training Materials, Awareness Videos, Contact details, etc.



4.3 Hands- on practice by all States nodal officers on using MIS and Mobile Application by Sumeendranath, IT consultant, KSNDMC and

Shri Abhinand, SRO, KSNDMC

During the Session all the participants from States/ UTs successfully completed the tasks of login, filling and updating the data, downloading the Mobile App, etc. Both MIS Portal and Mobile App were appreciated by all the States/ UTs.





5. Review the status of implementation of Up- Scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme with all States and UTs.

During the last Session of the day, progress of implementation of the Scheme by all the States/ UTs was also reviewed by the NDMA. A state wise current status of all the States/UTs was also presented in the session. All the States status was marked in three colors i.e. Red,

Yellow & Green (Red indicating States/UTs which have not yet started training programme, Yellow indicating states which are not following the standard criteria/ parameters of the scheme & Green indicating which are conducting training programme successfully)

In the end of the session, States/ UTs, which are yet to



start the implementation, ensured that training programmes will begin in the month of August – September 2022. Many States/ UTs also informed that the process of procurement of Emergency Responder Kits (ERK) and Essential Emergency Resource Reserves (EERR) is underway and likely to be completed very soon. All the States/ UTs were also asked to document the best practices and success stories related to Aapda Mitra and share with NDMA.







NDMA also asked all the States/ UTs to submit the utilization certificates as per the norms of the Scheme to facilitate NDMA releasing the third and final installment.

6. Vote of Thanks by Shri Nawal Paraksh, Joint Advisor, NDMA

The day concluded with Vote of Thanks proposed by Shri Nawal Prakash, Joint Advisor, National Disaster Management Authority. In his vote of thanks, Joint Advisor, NDMA on behalf of all the participants expressed sincere gratitude to KSNDMC, Government of Karnataka for organizing this Workshop-cum-Training Programme and extending hospitality to all the participants.

- > Encouraged people who are suffering fever and go to the Hospital etc.











































Documentation



- Details of all volunteers such as, Aadhar Number, Mobile, Address etc on prescribed format of NDMA are being maintained at SDMA,DDMA and SDRF levels. Also being forwarded to NDMA at regular intervals.
- Training Module have been translated and printed into hindi and is being given to each volunteer during the training.
- During the 12 days training, performance examination is also being carried out and prizes are also given to 1'st 2'nd and 3'rd. This helps in motivating the volunteers.



APDA MITRA



- 10200 volunteers, of 25 Districts are to be trained.
- SDRF,Uttar Pradesh is the training institute for the training. 12 day residential training is being done at SDRF Headquarters Lucknow. Course details are as per NDMA guidelines.
- 1770 volunteers, with 150 female volunteers of 10 Districts have been trained in 11 batches. 307 Volunteers of NCC/NSS /PRD/Scout or Civil Defense.
- Emergency Responder Kits (14 Items) have been procured and are being distributed to all volunteers.
- EERR Kits (30 Items) have been procured and distributed to all 25 districts.









































