All India Impact Based Weather Warning Bulletin

Weather Warnings for next 7 days is given below: (Graphics for warnings & rainfall distribution (Table 1) are given below the text:

29th March (Day 1):

- **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- **Heat wave conditions** very likely at isolated places over Odisha and Gangetic West Bengal.
- ❖ Hot and Humid Conditions very likely at isolated places over Odisha, Assam & Meghalaya, Tripura and coastal areas of Gujarat state.
- **Strong Surface winds (speed reaching 20 30 kmph gusting to 40 kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Northwest India and adjoining Madhya Pradesh.
- **Dust raising winds (30-40 kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Uttar Pradesh.

30th March (Day 2):

- **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam.
- **\display Heat wave conditions** very likely at isolated places over Odisha.
- **\Display Hot and Humid Conditions** very likely at isolated places over Odisha, Assam & Meghalaya, Tripura and coastal areas of Gujarat state.

31st March (Day 3):

- *Thunderstorm accompanied with gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & lightning very likely at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada; with gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; with lightning at isolated places over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe, Konkan & Goa and South Interior Karnataka.
- **\Display Hot and Humid Conditions** likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Tripura and coastal areas of Gujarat state.



01st April (Day 4):

- ❖ Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50 60 kmph) accompanied with lightning & hail likely at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada; Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning, gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & hail at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, North Interior Karnataka; with gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & lightning at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Coastal Karnataka; with gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Gujarat Region, Kerala & Mahe, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka; with lightning likely at isolated places over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Saurashtra & Kutch.
- **\Delta** Hot and Humid Conditions likely at isolated places over coastal areas of Gujarat state.

02nd April (Day 5):

- ❖ Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50 60 kmph) accompanied with lightning & hail likely at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, North Interior Karnataka; Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning, gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & hail at isolated places over Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha; with gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & lightning at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Coastal Karnataka, Konkan & Goa, Telangana, South Interior Karnataka; with gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over Gujarat Region, Kerala & Mahe, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema; with lightning likely at isolated places over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Saurashtra & Kutch.
- **\display Hot and Humid Conditions** likely at isolated places over coastal areas of Gujarat state.

03rd April (Day 6):


Heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe.







Impact expected and action suggested due Heat Wave conditions over Odisha on 29th & 30th and Gangetic West Bengal on 29th March.

Orange alert Areas

- ➤ High temperature & increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
- ➤ High health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- ➤ Avoid heat exposure keep cool. Avoid dehydration.
- > Drink sufficient water- even if not thirsty.
- ➤ Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. to keep yourself hydrated.

Yellow alert Areas

- ➤ Moderate temperature & heat is tolerable for general public but moderate health concern likely for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- > Avoid heat exposure.
- ➤ Wear lightweight, light colour, loose, cotton clothes.
- Cover your head, use a cloth, hat or umbrella.

Impact expected and action suggested due to isolated thunderstorm with lightning/gusty winds & Hailstorm over central & south Peninsular India during 31st March-02nd April.

Impact expected:

- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ➤ Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

Action suggested:

- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- ➤ Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- > Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- > Immediately get out of water bodies.
- ➤ Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.






