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

Aapda Mitra volunteers have rendered great work in disaster response activities during recent floods and cyclone.

Introduction

In the event of a disaster, it's often the local volunteers from the affected community who step in as the initial responders. The role of community volunteers in disaster response can have a significant impact because the effectiveness of the initial response is of paramount importance in minimizing both economic and human losses. Therefore, there is a crucial necessity to provide essential training to these community volunteers in disaster management, enabling them to react promptly and collaborate effectively with relevant authorities in rescue and relief efforts.

In order to achieve this goal, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) launched a pilot program called Aapda Mitra Scheme, in year 2016 in 30 districts in 25 States/UTs that are most vulnerable to floods. The goal was to train 6,000 community volunteers in disaster response, with a focus on flood-related skills, enrolling around 200 volunteers in each district. The project successfully trained over 5,500 volunteers, and ever since then these trained volunteers have actively participated in response to various calamities as part of efforts by the civil administration.

"Building on the success of the pilot program and in response to positive feedback and requests from all States/Union Territories, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), in collaboration with States/UTs, is implementing the Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme." This initiative has a total budget of Rs. 369.41 crores and seeks to train 1,00,000 volunteers in 350 districts across India which are prone to landslides, cyclones, earthquakes, and floods. The purpose of this scheme is to provide community volunteers with the skills and basic equipment that they need to serve as first responders in the aftermath of a disaster.

Community-Based Disaster Management

Community-Based Disaster Management (CBDM) is a paradigm shift in disaster preparedness and response, emphasizing the pivotal role of local communities in safeguarding themselves against natural or man-made calamities. At its core, CBDM acknowledges that communities are not passive recipients of aid but active agents in disaster risk reduction. It involves a collaborative approach that empowers communities to identify, understand, and mitigate their unique vulnerabilities, making them more resilient in the face of adversity.

Community engagement, capacity building, risk reduction measures, early warning systems, and inclusion are all important components of CBDM. The core value is community engagement, which encourages active participation and cooperation among community people, local governments, and key stakeholders. Individuals are equipped with important skills through capacity building, allowing them to respond quickly and effectively during disasters. Risk reduction techniques include the execution of practical strategies such



as infrastructure improvement, land-use planning, and the creation of secure evacuation routes. Early warning systems and effective communication channels are put in place to ensure that crucial information gets to the appropriate people at the right time. Furthermore, CBDM emphasizes participation, addressing the specific needs of vulnerable people to ensure that disaster resilience is a holistic endeavor.

CBDM has many positive effects. As communities develop the expertise and resources to meet immediate demands when disaster strikes, rapid responses become the norm. Local resources and skills are fully used, reducing the need for outside assistance. This not only expedites recovery but also safeguards affected communities' self-reliance and dignity. Additionally, CBDM promotes a culture of preparedness and partnership that goes beyond catastrophe events, strengthening local unity and long-term resilience.

CBDM is a ray of hope in a world increasingly threatened by the increasing impact of climate change and a rising array of natural and man-made disasters. It symbolizes the concept that, when given the right tools and knowledge, community can not only resist but even achieve in the aftermath of disasters. By embracing CBDM, communities may create a more resilient, safe, and sustainable future for all life & property.

"Aapda Mitra" - An Innovative and Transformative Initiative

Objective

- □ To train able-bodied community volunteers in multi disaster response at the taluka/block level in each of the project districts.
- In addition to training the volunteers in life-saving skills, the scheme would also train them in disaster response, coordination and relief assistance.
- □ To create a community emergency stockpile/reserve at the district/ block level, containing essential light search and rescue equipments, medical first-aid kits, etc.

Aapda Mitra – Pilot Version

NDMA launched a centrally sponsored scheme on 30th May, 2016 which was focused on training of 6000 volunteers in disaster response in 30 most flood prone districts of 25 State/UTs (Aapda Mitra). The scheme was completed on 31st March, 2021.

Up-scaling of Aapda Mitra scheme:

NDMA in partnership with States/UTs is implementing "Up-scaling of Aapda MitraScheme" at a total cost of Rs. 369.41 crores to train 1,00,000 volunteers in 350 districts of India which highly prone to landslide, cyclone, earthquake and flood by 31st March, 2024.

The components of the scheme are as follows:

- Translation and Printing of Training Modules, I-card & Certificate for volunteers
- Purchase of Emergency Responder Kit (ERK), including Group Insurance for trained volunteers. The insurance will cover death, permanent total disability, permanent partial disability, temporary total disability, and hospital expenses
- D Purchase of Emergency Essential Resource Reserve (EERR) for each District
- Grant for repair & maintenance of equipments under EERR
- Management Information System (MIS) for overall monitoring of the Scheme: Information regarding no. of volunteers trained, trainer details, training institutions profile, procured items under ERK and EERR, financial data and insurance is being updated on Aapda Mitra MIS portal regularly. Mobile application has been also developed for live-tracking of trained volunteers.

Aapda Mitra at Glance

A total of 92,120 volunteers have been trained so far, out of the 1,00,000 volunteers planned across 350 districts which are most susceptible to natural disasters such as landslides, cyclones, earthquakes, and floods.

Training: Comprehensive training in disaster response, equipping volunteers with essential knowledge and skills. So far, training has been completed in 25 States/UTs i.e. (Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Chandigarh, Chhattisgarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli & Daman and Diu, Delhi, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Karnataka, Kerala, Ladakh, ,Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Odisha, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttarakhand and West- Bengal).

Aapda Mitra volunteers have been involved in over 25 disaster response operations so far. In these challenging instances, a courageous over 1,802 volunteers stepped up to aid their fellow citizens in distress. Their collaborative endeavors resulted in the successful rescue of 11,808 individuals, a feat that stands as a testament to their extraordinary dedication. Most notably, their actions played a pivotal role in saving 95 lives, highlighting the profound impact of our volunteers and their unwavering commitment to safeguarding lives during times of catastrophe.

"Volunteer Training: Building Preparedness and Skills"

The emergency response training for our volunteers has been a pivotal endeavor in preparing them for rapid and effective action during crises. Throughout the training, participants have exhibited a commendable commitment to mastering essential response techniques and protocols. This comprehensive program has not only bolstered their skills but also cultivated a strong sense of unity and purpose among our volunteers.

Emergency Responder Kit and Insurance for the volunteers



Display of Emergency Responder Kit (ERK)

Emergency Responder Kit has been provided to each Aapda Mitra volunteer to facilitate effective response while ensuring the safety of volunteers during disaster and crisis situations. This kit includes essential professional equipments and supplies that would be required for an effective response effort. The cost of the ERK is Rs. 10,000/- including life insurance cover. Each and every trained volunteer under this scheme would have also a life insurance cover of Rs. 5 lacs and medical coverage of up to Rs. 50,000 for a period of 3 years. It will also cover permanent total disability, permanent partial disability and temporary total disability.

This reserve consists of a wide range of essential supplies and resources that will sustain and support the community during times of crisis. The cost of 1 unit EERR is Rs. 20 lakhs.

Odisha

Lord-Jagannath Rathyatra-Puri

Every year in the month of Asadha (June-July), the renowned Rathayatra (Car Festival) of Lord Jagannath, Balabhadra, and Devi Subhadra takes place in Puri, Odisha, attracting 20-25 lakh people from around the world. Balasore Train Accident

On June 2, 2023, a tragic train collision occurred at Bahanaga Bazar Station in Odisha's Balasore district, claiming 292 lives and injuring thousands.
